Letter from the President



If you've been to worship lately, you will have noticed our newly restored front They look awesome and proudly display our LCMS logo! In addition to his Sunday morning guitar skills, Eric Harrison knows a few things about construction. On behalf of the Trustees, he used those skills to oversee the restoration work.

We recently received a significant donation to cover replacement our exterior church sign located at the corner of Monroe and Brackenridge. On behalf of the Trustees, Mitch Teeters is leading the charge on this project. He recently cleaned out the flower bed in front of the existing sign and is handling the bid process. Expect a new sign in the near future.

I reported last month that both air conditioners in the sanctuary were leaking coolant and had been treated with stop leak. As of now they continue to work. We have also had the Workshop unit repaired. Unfortunately, the conference room unit has now stopped working properly, so we continue to have it and the narthex out of service. It is troubling as both broken units are less than five years old, and we have now exhausted much of our repair budget for the year. Before we proceed with fixing these two units, our vendor has performed a survey of the fourteen units we have. The Trustees and Council will review this analysis and may have recommendations for the voters at the August

Jordan is proceeding with the revamp of our website and will hopefully be ready to go soon. The Council will meet in July to discuss these and other issues and set the August meeting date and agenda.

"Friends"

I had a wonderful loving surprise a few weeks back. A dear friend of mine, who I had lost touch with over the years, reached out to find me. She contacted the church office and asked them to give me her phone number with a message to please call. When I got the message, I called immediately, and she and her husband and I talked and laughed for over two hours. O!!! It was such a blessing to visit with them! We knew each other at Christ Lutheran for many years, in high school where we both were in the band and "hung out" together, and we were bridesmaids in each other's wedding, a year apart, 50 years ago. We talked of church matters and what wonderful friends fellow believers are, and at 70+ years of age, we compared our various ailments and number of surgeries. But mostly, we spoke of God's gift of faith. It was hard to say "good-bye." We live many miles apart and travel is difficult, and I feel we may not see each other again. I've known and still know many folks I think of and love as friends, but never felt comfortable enough with anyone that I could pour my heart out to, or share my innermost feelings with. I suppose in that respect, my close friends were my mom and dad, and my husband, all dead now, and of course, my dear sister. Perhaps this is true for many people. Friendships, close or not, are not forever. People move away, interests change, feelings get hurt, feelings fade, people die. That's just life in a sinful world. However, there is one truly close friendship that I cling to and that I know is forever, and that is my friendship with my Savior, Jesus! A favorite hymn of my family's is "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." As an organist, I enjoyed playing it for worship. It's an easy and fun melody to play and to sing, and the words are mostly simple, relatable, and comforting. The congregation always seemed "energized" by the hymn. The text was written by Joseph Scriven who had migrated to Canada from his home in Dublin, Ireland. When he learned his mother was seriously ill and he could not be with her, he wrote her a "letter of comfort" and enclosed the text. A referenced Bible passage for the hymn is John 15:14-16. At the Last Supper, Jesus told His Disciples these words of comfort, "You are my friends if you do what I command. I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you." And verse 17, "This is my command: love each other." What an amazing gift! Jesus gave His life for us, and, He chooses us, as believers, to be His friends! When we feel alone, Jesus is still there. In sickness and death, Jesus clings to us. He rejoices with us, feels our pain, sees our tears. He is faithful to us and takes care of us. He "keeps in touch with us" through His Word and Sacraments, and He listens for us to "keep in touch" with Him in our prayers. We can tell Him everything, and His love for us will not fade. As we live in the knowledge of this dearest of all relationships, how can we not treat each other as anything but friends, loving each other as Jesus taught by His example, and telling them of His love. I know I must try harder. My friendship with my Savior is something I treasure greatly. I feel comfortable with Him, and find that when I bring my ALL to Him, asking His forgiveness and help, His Holy Spirit strengthens me, and the Light of Jesus grows brighter, and with words of thanksgiving, I feel His peace envelop me, and I am reassured of brighter days as His chosen friend. Whipped Sheet Cake Ice Cream

This was the winning recipe for Best Sweet in the November 2019 Texas Coop Power magazine. Sounds so good and refreshing!

2 cups heavy whipping cream 1/4 cup granulated sugar 1 can sweetened condensed milk 3/4 cup cocoa powder 3/4 cup chopped pecans or walnuts 2 tsp. vanilla extract

In a large bowl, use a mixer on high speed to whip cream until stiff peaks form. Add sugar a small amount at a time to aid in peak formation. In a separate bowl, mix condensed milk, cocoa powder, chopped nuts and vanilla. Fold the whipped cream into the condensed milk mixture and transfer to a freezer-safe covered contained. Freeze until firm, at least 24 hours. (The author suggests adding dulce de leche, crushed candy bars, ice cream cone pieces, etc., and says, "It has a deliciously smooth taste that will please even the most die-hard ice cream lover.")
